- Christmas is celebrated on the 25th of December in many countries around the world.

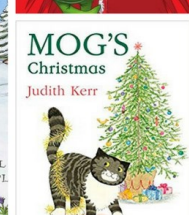
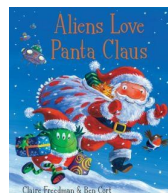
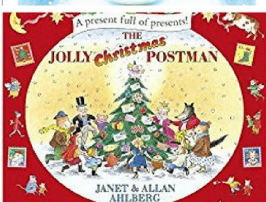
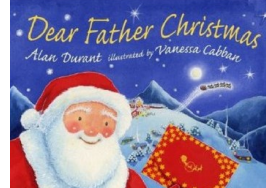
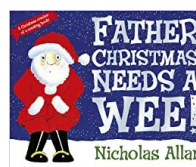
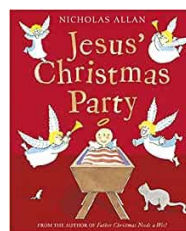
- People give presents to friends and family at Christmas.
