

Facts and Pictures:

God promised to make Abraham the father of a great people and said that Abraham and his descendants must obey God. In return God would guide them and protect them and give them the land of Israel



God tells Noah to build an ark and fill it with every species on the earth. When the ark is full, a flood covers the earth. Only Noah and those on his ark survive. God makes a covenant with humanity never to destroy the world again. Noah was obedient to the Lord in spite of the ridicule

of his friends and neighbours. Noah's family listened and obeyed God, so they were saved from the Flood, but the wicked people who would not listen and obey were drowned.

- •Explain why Hanukkah is so important to Jewish People. How is Hanukkah like other celebrations that you know?
