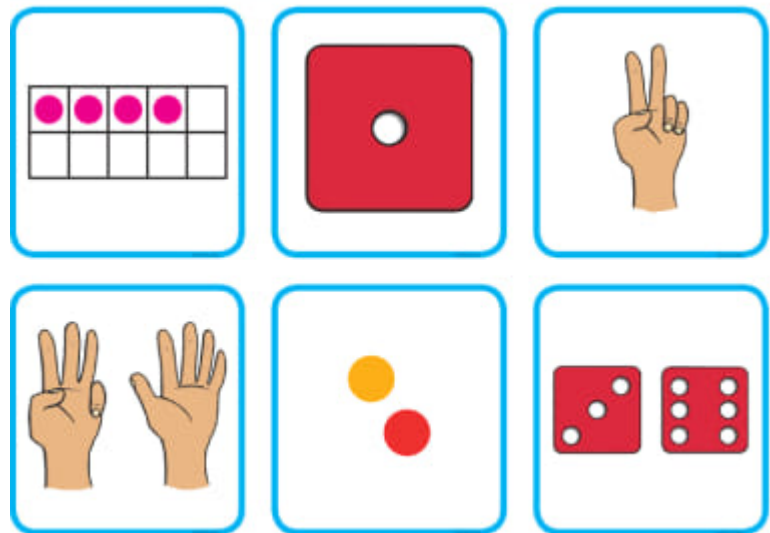
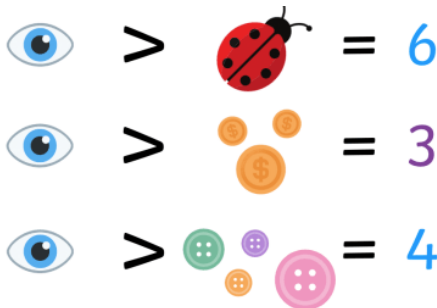


Supporting your child's development- FSI

Subitising

Subitising is being able to visually see a number of objects instantly without needing to count them one at a time.

If you have played a game with a die and been able to say how many dots are on the die without counting then you will have been subitising!



*I can see 4.
I can see 2 and 2.
I can see 3 and 1.
I can see 1 and 1
and 1 and 1.*

*I can see 2.
I can see 1 and 1.*

Communication

This month's focus is: Getting your child's attention before talking.

It can be difficult for children to pay attention if there are lots of distractions and background noise. Make sure your child is ready to listen to you by using their name or gently touching their arm to get their attention before speaking.

Phonics

Element 2- Instrumental Sounds

Why? To develop an awareness of sounds that are made with instruments and noise makers. To listen to and appreciate the difference between sounds made with instruments. To develop and use a wider vocabulary to talk about sounds.

How can you help at home?

- Experiment with different instruments that you have access to at home.
- Create your own instruments from everyday objects or recycling e.g. pans as drums.
- Mimic instrument sounds.
- Watch live music being played.
- Listen to instruments and move in different ways.
